The Shawnee Splash Water Park was recognized as a 2016 Dream Design Award Winner by *Aquatics International*. The pool first opened in the 1930's and was in need of some modern updates to bring kids and families back to the pool. One of the features added was a Vortex Elevation in a new zero depth leisure pool area. The Elevation includes multiple water effects on and around the structure, a small water slide and a big super splash dumping bucket. The Elevation play structure is perfect for the little ones to enjoy while parents enjoy the nearby shade. This updated water park is definitely the talk of the town and a great place to spend the hot summer days!

The small town community came together to create a Splashpad and park dedicated to the memory of Lane Azlin, a young boy who was taken far too early but left behind a memory of joy and happiness. Since he loved the water so much, the Citizens Improvement League of Wewoka, the City of Wewoka and the family of Lane decided to build a Splashpad in remembrance. The Splashpad consists of numerous things Lane enjoyed such as turtles, fish, a bullfrog, flowers and a number of animal themed water cannons and a cool motorcycle feature. This Splashpad brings the community together with a perfect spot to cool down in the hot summer and to honor a young boy who will never be forgotten.

Coming Soon: The Largest Splashpad in Oklahoma!



The City of Moore will be opening their third Splashpad at Little River Park in the summer of 2017. Their second Splashpad, Parmele Park, with its forest theme, has been a huge success and won a Dream Design Award from *Aquatics International* in 2015. The Little River Park Splashpad will be the largest Splashpad in Oklahoma and includes a unique pirate theme. The focal point is a large Vortex Elevation Pirate Ship with multiple decks and includes various water effects on and around the structure ensuring a full water soaking. This Pirate Ship includes two water slides and has numerous water cannons, a super splash dumping bucket and a rising flag both with skull and bones emphasizing the ultimate pirate experience. The Pirate Ship Elevation will be surrounded by numerous sea animals and plant life including an Octopus, Fish, Shark, Crab, Turtle, Sea Pelican, Palm Trees, Leaves and Seaweed. Pirate Cannons, a seat wall, benches, shades and tables add to the unique design. We are excited to see the finished project in the summer of 2017 and hear the little pirates splashing around and zooming down the water slides.
